



Roots, Shoots and Fruits



Year 3 — Summer Term 2 2025

What's it all about? This topic is an interactive science-based topic exploring what plants are, the different processes involved in their life cycle and their importance in the natural world.



Scientists: We will be learning about the parts of flowering plants and what their purpose is, the life cycle of a plant, as well as pollination, germination and seed dispersal.

Readers: Using Destination Reader we will revisit the strategies taught so far including evaluating, questioning, predicting, summarising, inferring and making connections. We will apply them to our reading with increased confidence.

Spellers: We have finished our Y3 books and are moving on to looking at high frequency words for Year 3 and 4.

Writers: We will be using Charlie and the Chocolate Factory in our writing this term, exploring formal and informal letters, diaries and descriptive writing.

Mathematicians: The maths topics we will be exploring include, time, shape, position and direction and revising previous learning ready for Year 4.

PE: We will be exploring the 'Health and Fitness' unit, looking at how our body reacts to exercise.

Art: We will be exploring different ways of printing, including making our own tiles to print with.

RE: We will be looking at how promises are celebrated in many religions across the world. If you would like to share how promises are made and kept in your religion, please let us know!

Geography: We will learn about our local area and explore the human and physical features of Surrey and Woking. We will also compare Woking to London.

Musicians: We will be using xylophones to compose melodies using crotchets, quavers and semiquavers.

Computing: We will be learning how to use presentation software

French: We will continue practising reading, writing and speaking with confidence in a range of topics

PSHE: We will be learning about growing and changing. A letter has gone out to parents detailing the content of this unit..
