

# Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum and Philosophy



## Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)


The EYFS sets standards for the learning, development and care of children from birth to 5 years old. Learning takes place through a mixture of child-initiated play, actively supported by adults and focused learning, with adults guiding the learning through playful, rich experiential integrated activities.

The Unique Child reaches out to relate to people and things through the Characteristics of Effective Learning, which move through all areas of learning.

- · playing and exploring
- · active learning
- · creating and thinking critically

Children develop in the context of relationships and the environment around them.

This is unique to each family, and reflects individual communities and cultures.



Prime areas are fundamental, work together, and are move through to support development in all other areas.

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language
- · Physical Development

Specific areas include essential skills and knowledge for children to participate successfully in society.

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

## **Induction**



#### **Nursery**

✓Induction will take place across the course of one to two weeks for Nursery- depending on child's hours.

#### **Reception**

- √Children will be separated into two groups and will attend for a morning **OR** afternoon session on the 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> of September
- ✓ On Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> September ALL children will attend until 12.30am
- ✓ On Thursday 11th **ALL** children will attend until 14.00pm ( with lunch)
- ✓ From Friday 12th, **ALL** children attend full time

- To wear my school uniform- please ensure it is all **named**.

- Sensible, Velcro school shoes (no open toe sandals or boots).


### Over the summer please help me to...


