
## The Oaktree Children's questionnaire Results 2022

## Summary

In summary, we are pleased with the outcomes from this questionnaire and believe it shows the school in a positive light. There are obviously children who are concerned about the behaviours of others both in terms of bullying and in general behaviour in lessons and around school. The Oaktree is an inclusive school who recognise every child has the right to an education. We do have on roll a number of children with challenging behaviours or special educational needs and it is a case of educating all to understand why some children present the way in which they do, and for staff to be extra virulent ensuring that all children are safe, not on the receiving end of bullying behaviours and are being educated in expected behaviours continuously. Behaviour is a priority on our School Development Plan next year and we hope to see improvements in next years children's questionnaire as a result.
